Guidelines for Dual Degree Programs

A dual degree program allows students to receive a BS/MS or BA/MA in five years following a rigorous, efficient, accelerated curriculum. This highly selective group of students will enjoy close faculty mentoring and the opportunity to engage in specialized research projects with faculty. Dual degree programs are becoming increasingly popular and are highly recommended in today's market.

 - **iii.** The proposed schedule of course offerings for the entire 5-year dual degree program.

3. Students:

- **a.** Estimate the number of students in the program and the pool from which they will be selected.
- **b.** Describe requirements for admission to and expected retention of students in the proposed program

4. Administration:

- a. Estimate the anticipated administrative increments imposed by dual program.
 - i. Need for additional secretarial help.
 - ii. Need for additional office equipment and supplies
 - iii. Need for additional travel, publication costs and other funds.
- **b. Budget** (if needed)
- **c. Comparisons:** Compare the proposed program at the University of Miami with five high quality established programs at comparable universities.
